Network staff and physicians are among the very first groups to receive the influenza A (H1N1) vaccine. The Human Resources Health Unit started visiting facilities on October 28. Here are the next vaccination dates:

### PARKING PERMIT – CLSC DU LAC-SAINT-LOUIS

As of November 9, employees who wish to take advantage of free parking in the CLSC du Lac-Saint-Louis must obtain a self-adhesive parking permit. Those who don't have a permit will be required to pay, and a system similar to the Montréal parking meters will be installed. Coupons will be available at reception for employees who come to the CLSC for meetings. Employees will simply need to place them in their vehicle in a visible location. Drivers who do not respect this measure or who don't have a permit or a coupon will have their vehicles towed. A two-week grace period will be allowed, during which time offenders will receive a notice. Please note that there is free city parking in front of the CLSC (behind the convenience store).
